#### Tree Assessor on-site check list

Pre-onsite checks/preparations also recommended - protection status, extent of information provided in Application, type of "affect" alleged, any other supporting information.

NOTE: This checklist is based on the functions of Assessors under QCAT Act, and the role of the Tree Assessor to gather facts by observations and other simple tree tests, about the trees and alleged tree damage, obstructions etc, and provide expert recommendations that help QCAT to:

- a) determine if the dispute is within NDR jurisdiction
- b) determine if the affects and actions sought are valid re NDR jurisdiction
- c) determine and specify appropriate actions, if any, that may lead to efficient and fair resolution of the tree dispute

#### Introduction/purpose

- I may ask some questions of each of you to help with my report to the Tribunal.
- I'll then share with you a summary of my relevant observations and recommendations.
- I'll ask if there are any points of agreement.
- I'll then clarify the points remaining in disagreement between the parties, based on the application, my observations and recommendations.
- I expect XYZ behaviour
- What happens after this meeting/inspection is I'll provide a report with recommendations to the Tribunal, which will be shared with the parties. The Tribunal will consider whether it is appropriate to make orders in accordance with my recommendation and if they do you will be asked to consent to those orders. If you don't agree then the matter will be listed for a directions hearing and you will receive directions about the submissions and other material to be filed to progress the matter to a hearing.
