IT IS THE RENEWED DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL, BY CONSENT, THAT:

- 1. The Respondents, **Nadina Leigh Teskera** and **Scott Anthony Murray** must trim the Virburnum forming a hedge situated on their land (the Virburnum) to a height of 4.00 metres from the ground.
- 2. The Respondents, **Nadina Leigh Teskera** and **Scott Anthony Murray**, must undertake ongoing maintenance of the Virburnum every six months to maintain the Virburnum's height in the months of July and January.
- 3. The Respondents, **Nadina Leigh Teskera** and **Scott Anthony Murray** will be responsible for all costs associated with the work outlined in Order 1.
- 4. If Nadina Leigh Teskera and Scott Anthony Murray fail to undertake any of the work outlined in Order 1 (the Incomplete Work) by the required time, Carole Parrella can engage her own contractor with appropriate insurances (including Public Liablity Insurance) to enter Nadina Leigh Teskera and Scott Anthony Murray's land and undertake the Incomplete Work subject to Carole Parrella giving Nadina Leigh Teskera and Scott Anthony Murray fourteen (14) days' written notice of that intention. The earliest date Carole Parrella can serve Nadina Leigh Teskera and Scott Anthony Murray fourteen (14) days' written notice of that intention is the 22 August or the 22 Febraury.
- 5. The costs incurred by Carole Parrella engaging her own contractor to undertake the Incomplete Work in default of Nadina Leigh Teskera and Scott Anthony Murray is recoverable from Nadina Leigh Teskera and Scott Anthony Murray as a debt without further notice being required to be given.
